ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Local A/Ls: Minimum 3 "S" passes in any stream with English as a Main Subject.

Cambridge/Edexcel A/Ls: Minimum 3 "D" passes with English / English Literature as a Main Subject.

Applicants should also pass the Aptitude Test conducted by SLIIT.

The BEd (Hons) in English is a four-year full-time degree programme. This programme is aimed at developing professional teachers to teach English as a subject in secondary schools up to GCE Advanced Level. It provides a balance between the disciplines of English Language, Literature and Education. The initial two years of the study programme intend to lay a solid foundation in the field of English Language, English Literature and Education studies while the last two years focus more on the practical aspects of teaching English Language and Literature.



The students are expected to engage in a compulsory teaching practice of at least 10 weeks in a school setting, in addition to conducting a research study; as requirements for the completion of the degree programme. The programme thus ensures that the students develop a thorough subject knowledge and obtain adequate training and practice in teaching English in order to become professionally qualified, competent teachers of English.
