CRANIOMAXILLOFACIAL SURGERY

Professor Jeffery Marcus
Durham, USA

Dr Jeffrey Marcus was born in Detroit, Michigan. He attended undergraduate university and medical school at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, during which time he took his first of two adventures exploring Australia and New Zealand. After completing his residency training in General Surgery and then Plastic Surgery at Northwestern University in Chicago, Illinois, he did two fellowships at the Hospital for Sick Children, University of Toronto. The first was in Pediatric Plastic Surgery and the second was in Craniofacial Surgery. He was recruited to Duke University in 2002 to create specialized programs in pediatric plastic surgery, cleft and craniofacial surgery, rhinoplasty, and facial paralysis surgery. Dr Marcus has a special interest in nasal surgery, and his practice in rhinoplasty covers nearly all aspects of functional, aesthetic, and congenital conditions. He was a Past-President of The Rhinoplasty Society and has led numerous national/international symposia through the American Society of Plastic Surgeons and American Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery. Dr Marcus created the multidisciplinary Duke Facial Paralysis Team in 2002, offering a complete treatment range for facial paralysis, including sophisticated innovations in microsurgical treatment and modern nerve transfer techniques. Dr Marcus has collaborated across many specialties throughout his career, but notably with Head and Neck Surgery. He is a member of the American Academy of Facial Plastic Surgeons and is a member of the editorial board for JAMA Facial Plastic Surgery (now FPS&AM). Duke University has a long history of treating children with clefts, and Duke was one of the first multidisciplinary teams in the United States. Dr Marcus recruited a world-renowned Craniofacial Orthodontist, Dr Pedro Santiago who co-directs the Center along with cleft surgeon, Alexander Allori – an international thought leader in the study of cleft outcomes. Together, the Center's leaders and team members have established Duke as one of the most prominent centers for Cleft and Craniofacial care in the US. Dr Marcus advocates strongly for the involvement of academic surgical programs in global health and emphasizes the importance of mutual educational exchange over clinical service alone. He lectures and teaches worldwide and has created numerous educational fellowship opportunities for plastic surgeons, often in conjunction with Operation Smile. As a serial inventor, Dr Marcus holds numerous patents and has developed and licensed technology that is used in maxillofacial surgery worldwide as well as devices used in other surgical areas. Dr Marcus is a loving husband to his wife Jill with whom he traveled again to New Zealand for their honeymoon. He is also a proud father to two children, Owen (14) and Claire (11). They plan as a family to find more opportunities to spend time in Australia and New Zealand.
