The Teacher Librarian establishes, develops and manages the smooth operation of the ISKL Elementary School(ES) Library, promotes a love of reading and literature and teaches appropriate library, research and information literacy skills to individuals, students in small groups, whole class and across the age range in ES.

The Teacher Librarian is tasked to maintain an intellectually stimulating learning environment which supports and enhances the delivery of the school's educational programmes and is consistent with ISKL's vision and mission to help ISKL students develop the skills they need to be successful learners and to foster a lifelong love of reading and learning.

RESPONSIBILITIES inclusive but not limited to:

- Develop and maintain a vibrant library environment, with a diverse collection of books, resources and other materials, representing the diversity of the student body and supporting the range of the educational programmes.
- Ensure the development of research and independent study skills through taught courses and individual and group support
- Promote and support literacy amongst the school community, leading reading and writing workshops and classes
- In liaison with specialist teachers, encourage the use of the Library across all subject areas
- Lead student library induction sessions, library skills sessions and support class visits to the Library.
- Contribute to the professional development of the Library team.
- Work with the English and EAL Departments to create a whole school information literacy plan, integrating information literacy across the curriculum
- Maintain book lists supporting the development of study skills and wider reading for students.
- Work with school leaders to develop a whole school literature plan to foster a love of reading.
- Ensure that the Library is equipped with an up-to-date range of relevant hard and digital resources
- Maintain the Library management system to ensure that all resources are easily accessible
- Organize and manage special events, author visits, competitions, collaborations and seminars that promote literacy and the love of reading.
- Actively support the vision, ethos, culture and policies of the ISKL
