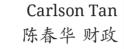
Let us embrace the future with confidence and bright aspirations, so that we will emerge stronger than ever.

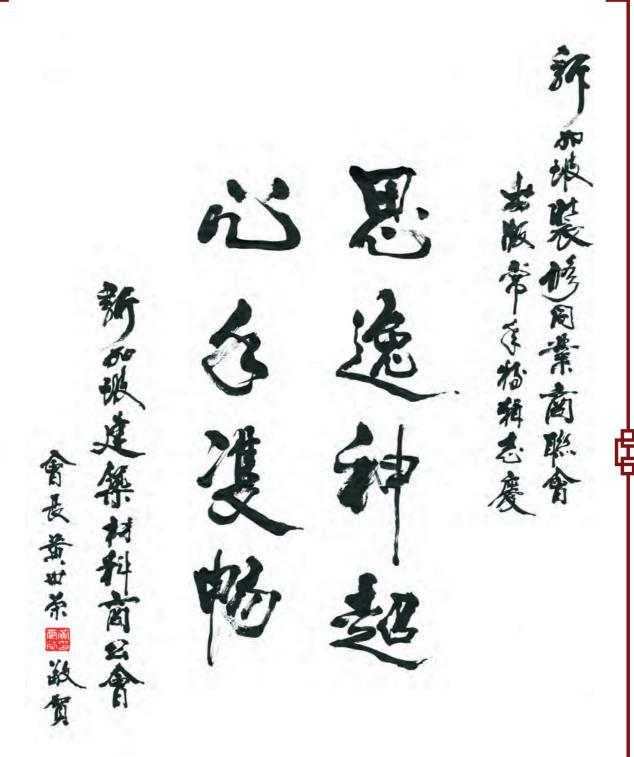

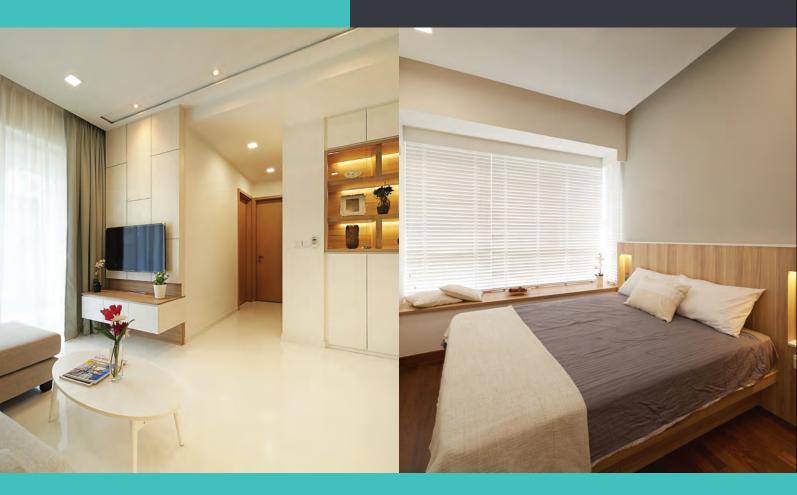

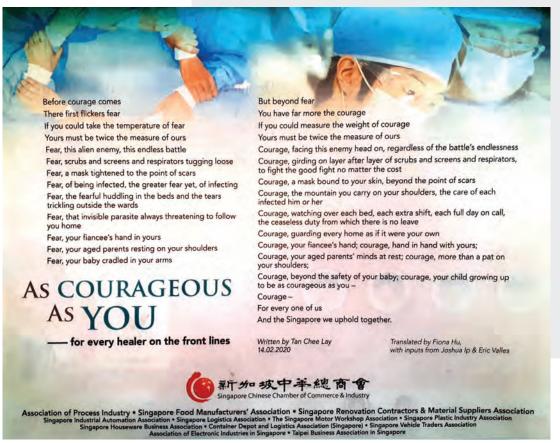

"Renovation contractors face shortage in manpower, material supplies, renovation delays and price hikes" 装修承包商面临劳工和物力短缺、装修工程进度迟延及成本价上扬的问题

Though the restrictions of the circuit breaker will gradually be relaxed from next month onwards, RCMA expects long delays in renovations due to shortage of labour. Cost in materials is also expected to rise.

RCMA pointed out that with material supplies mostly imported from China and other countries; it's difficult to determine whether there will be a shortage of supplies. Safe distancing measures in the renovation site are also expected to push up the cost of the renovation.

In this TV news feature, RCMA pointed that due to the circuit breaker, a total of 2,200 renovation projects commissioned by more than 200 of its committee members was suspended. These projects could resume work next week but RCMA urged homeowners to take alternative measures in inspecting the renovation sites.

新加坡装修同业商联会助理秘书陈顺发也表示自己正面临新马入境限制所导致的劳工短缺。由于他的装修员工大部分是由分包商聘请的马来西亚人,所以停工期间他们已回国。但他们现在无法进入新加坡,因此工程预计会花费更长的时间完工。他说:"尤其是瓦工和木匠,短时间要申请让他们回来是有点困难,现在只能动用所有在新加坡的工人进行装修。"



"Coronavirus: Companies are short of manpower" 冠状病毒:公司人手不足

The Straits Times/Published 31st May 2020 《海峡时报》/ 刊登于2020年5月31

During the nation's circuit breaker which lasted almost eight weeks, all renovations came to standstill. On June 2nd 2020, with the circuit breaker lifted, renovations were then allowed to resume but it came with a caveat. The Straits Times reported that many renovation firms did not have sufficient manpower to complete the renovations—as many of their workers remained stuck in Malaysia.

With movements in the flow of people between Malaysia and Singapore restricted in bid to control the outbreak, this caused the shortage of manpower in the local renovation scene. In this news article, President of RCMA Dr Sky Tan said that "About 80 per cent of workers in the renovation trade, for instance, are Malaysians", and "Most of them are now in Malaysia."

More importantly, this labour shortage resulted in an imminent delay for renovations – as renovation contractors needed to comply with the safety criteria as well. Dr Sky Tan also addressed this in the article and said: "We can't start work immediately."

更重要的是, 装修承包商还需遵守各项安全措施, 而此劳力短缺绝对会影响装修工程的进度。 陈锦龙博士在此报道中也提到: "我们不可能立即开工。"



"Complicated application procedures and manpower shortage make it difficult for renovation works to resume"

Many renovation contractors are facing challenges with the online application process of BCA to resume renovation works. Some revealed that it took them a day to complete the application and yet, it was still rejected by the authorities. Other than this requirement, their employees must participate in epidemic prevention training courses, but the scheduled class dates are of different timings, and that makes it difficult for them to resume work.

"Singapore and Malaysia discuss cross-border travel, gets support from employers" 新马商议跨境出入,获员工雇主支持

With Singapore cooperating with Malaysia to resume cross-border travel, both countries are trying to resolve the travel needs of its residents. Employers interviewed said that re-opening the border not only solves the shortage of manpower, it also saves the cost of providing temporary housing for Malaysian employees.

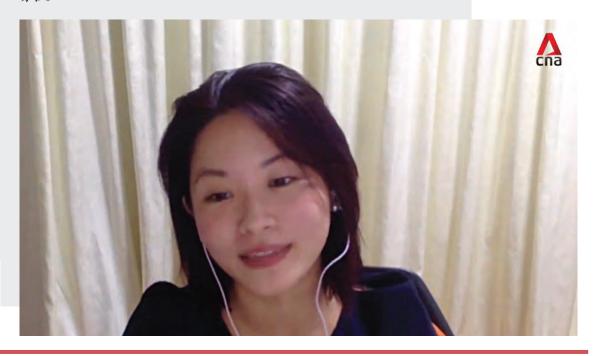
CNA938 Radio Talk Show/Aired on 11th August 2020 英文电台CNA938访谈节目/于2020年8月11日播出

Secretariat Representative of RCMA Ms Gena Thien addresses how the renovation industry has been affected by the shortage in manpower in this live radio talk show segment. She said: "Our industry is heavily dependent on foreign labour. Around 70 to 80 percent of our labour comes from Malaysia, Bangladesh and China. With the borders still under lockdown, we are facing a shortage especially in skilled labour. We might have customers, but we are unable to deliver."

She added: "As renovators, we try to follow the agreed rate of the renovation package signed before the COVID-19 period. In terms of absorbing the additional costs incurred by the epidemic, it really depends on the company and customer. For instance, if the extra cost is low like only five percent, I'm sure that can be absorbed by the company. However, if it's 30 percent or more, we might have to share this burden with the customer."

新加坡装修同业商联会秘书代表张慧萱在此电台直播节目中提到,人手短缺对装修业的重大影响。她说:"我们的行业严重依赖外籍劳工。我们有大约70%至80%的劳动力来自马来西亚、孟加拉国和中国。由于各国边界仍处于封锁状态,我们正面临人手短缺的挑战,尤其是在熟练劳动力方面。我们或许会有生意,但却无法准时完工。"

In order to solve the foreign labour shortage which has culminated in renovation project delays, local renovators and the authorities are looking to work hand in hand to attract more local talents.

The proposed plan includes providing skill training in carpentry and tiling, which will reduce the dependence on foreign workers.

RCMA Chairman Dr Sky Tan said: "I think we can kill two birds with one stone. We can help create more jobs, and reduce the impact of the shortage of foreign workers."

Due to Malaysia's 2020 Movement Control Order, it has caused work delays for many local renovation companies. Although some employers in Singapore have applied for their Malaysian workers to enter Singapore through the periodic commuting arrangement, doing so has increased their cost.

"Construction firms struggle to bring in workers, hurting bottom lines" 建筑业引进工人困难重重 利润锐减

With firms in the construction sector struggling to bring workers back into Singapore even with the easing of entry restrictions, this has caused project delays of up to a year which has put a dent in bottom lines.

RCMA member Mr Nelson Leow says: We have to buy insurance for these workers, and to pay for their Stay-Home Notice and swab tests. It is also a concern whether these workers can settle down in their jobs. If we can produce and train more local workers in this industry, this could be a more sustainable solution in the long run."

This is where the newly-established RCMA Academy can step in to help. Offering niche courses (project management, tiling carpentry, plumbing, painting and more) that cater to the interior renovation industry, the academy is able to boost the local workforce; thereby reducing the reliance on foreign workers.

PIONEER RENOVATORS DISCUSSION 先锋一代装修商 谈论会

Pioneer Renovators Discuss about Renovation in the Early Days

BEING A RENOVATION CONTRACTOR WAS A TOUGH JOB IN THE PAST. THESE PIONEER RENOVATORS FROM THE RCMA COMMITTEE GIVE US MORE INSIGHTS.



Lim Ah Bah: Back in the past, renovators or contractors were called "mosquito contractors". To mark this memory, we have gathered a group of pioneer renovation contractors here to reminisce about the renovation industry in the eighties. Documenting this piece of history is our editor and our videographer. We hope by detailing this into the current edition of the RCMA renovation guidebook, our readers will have a better understanding about the past and present.

Firstly, allow me to introduce Tan Chim Hoon. He was the previous president of RCMA. Next is Tan Boon Sang. He was our previous secretary in RCMA. We also have C.N.

Tan joining us today and he was one of the three founders of RCMA. Last but not least, we are also graced by Chua Chwee Cheok, who was one of the pioneer renovators in our association.

The Housing Development Board (HDB) was previously known as Singapore Improvement Trust (SIT). The notorious Bukit Ho Swee Fire had destroyed many homes and thus, SIT needed to rebuild homes for the victims. SIT was later renamed 'Housing Development Board' by the People's Action Party (PAP). The new housing that HDB built comprised two bedrooms and one living hall. However, these spaces were completely bare; devoid



of flooring or even wall coverings. It made the new homeowners wonder how these empty spaces were even liveable. Some quick-thinking individuals decided to eke out a living by turning these cold and bare houses into liveable homes for the individuals. These individuals are therefore present in our discussion panel of speakers today. They will present their own accounts of how renovation was like back in the eighties, such as the expectations of homeowners back then.

C.N. Tan: From 1965 to 1975, people who originally lived in the kampong moved into HDB flats. The renovation industry started to flourish, with demands coming from these new flat owners. As compared to today's modern homeowner whom is well-informed, the homeowners back then did not have a clue on the materials we used for renovation. We needed to educate them on the types of materials utilised for their home renovation and at that time, these materials were commonly used. For instance, the flooring for the two-room flats would be Thai...

Lim Ah Bah: Teak

C.N. Tan: Yes... teak and terrazzo tiles in the living room and white wall tiles in the kitchen. Renovation for a two-bedroom flat unit cost typically around S\$1,500 to S\$3,000. There were also four or five-room flats but of course, these were much pricier. The renovation cost for an ordinary four-room flat for instance, can range from S\$6,000 to S\$8,000.

Chua Chwee Cheok: In the 1960s, we earned S\$15 a day, and that was considered a lot of money. For a two-bedroom HDB flat unit with mosaic tiles, the renovation cost can range from S\$1,200 to S\$1,500.

Lim Ah Bah: Including the kitchen?

Chua Chwee Cheok: Yes.

Lim Ah Bah: I remember the kitchen was done by government.

Chua Chwee Cheok: The kitchen is also included in the renovation. We just earned some money. At that time, we were not thinking of making big profits from renovation work; it was just an honest living. And our credibility as renovation contractors was very high. Whatever promised was always delivered to our homeowners.

Tan Chim Hoon: I specialised in custom carpentry.

As spoken earlier, the property market was robust and with so many HDB flats being built, that created a strong demand for carpentry works too. I learned about introducing instalments plans as payment for my carpentry business from my father. However, as soon as I entered the carpentry business, I discovered many repairs were required for the carpentry works. By providing repair services, I was earning a decent monthly income. The majority of my clients were Malays. They engaged me because of word-of-mouth recommendations since everyone knew me well in our community.

I soon learned about the trade of renovation from a neighbour who was in the industry. He mentored me while I gave the renovation trade a go, and my first home renovation as a contractor actually incurred losses. I didn't factor in the skirting cost into my charges and didn't calculate the full cost based on per square feet. Through this experience, I was able to understand how quotations work in order to turn a profit.

In 1985, after the election, the market plummeted. Many contractors ran away with the payment given by the



homeowners without delivering on the renovation. That was the period where I had the most renovation jobs and since I had no workers, I would sometimes sleep in the house to finish up the work and save time. The next morning, I would drive my small truck to where sand and cement were sold to bring these renovation materials back. I also needed to ensure all the materials were available for the workers to work on, as they would not start work without everything in place. And once they leave, it was very difficult to get them back.

Tan Boon Sang: I learnt to lay mosaic tiles. From apprentice to a full-fledged contractor, it took me two years to master this skill. At that time, we didn't need a license to take up jobs but later on when it became available, I applied for a license. After that, I rented an office and started doing business until 1985. There was great demand for constructing homes so it was difficult to find workers or even bricks. If you wanted to buy bricks, you had to pay the supplier first before he will even sell it to you. Later on, I ordered the bricks and marble slabs from Italy, and I also changed careers around that time.

Lim Ah Bah: To recap, 'mosquito contractors' were renovators who followed new homeowners around just to solicit business. As soon as these homeowners were at the void deck, these contractors swarmed around them and harassed them with questions like "Which floor do you live', or "I am working on a unit in this block too."

To summarise, since the 1970s, people started renovating their HDB flats. At that time, we saw these renovations happening in Redhill and Toa Payoh – where these areas had the first blocks of HDB flat units being built. Do you still remember how much these HDB flats with two bedrooms and one hall cost?

Tan Boon Sang: \$6,500

C.N. Tan: \$6,200

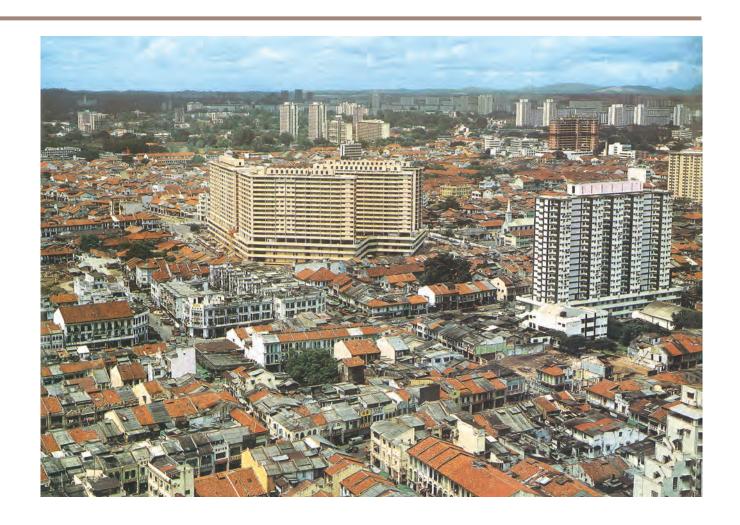
Lim Ah Bah: It was \$6,200. The renovation industry started at that time, however there were no official licenses being issued to carry out renovation works. In 1975, the HDB began to issue licenses, but there were not many given out; probably two to three hundred licenses. Everyone applied to get the licenses given by HDB and still continue to do so.

Through the inception of the renovation business comes other suppliers and service providers such as electricians, craftsmen and those supplying renovation materials. Though we may be a humble enterprise, we deserve recognition for all our hard work. This concludes our discussion of the history of the renovation industry.

七十年代的裝修行业

林亚峇:以前的装修商被人称为"蚊子装修商"。我们到这个年纪,老一辈的装修商应该把当时那段历史保留起来,就是拿来讲给大家听。今天我们请这位编者来帮我们做一个记录,把那段历史保留下来。我们今天也劳动我们的摄影师来录像和拍照。拍照的用意是要放在这本杂志,来增强它的说服力。

今天跟大家介绍,第一位是陈振雲。我们上一届的会长。接下来,这位是陳文献。陳文献是我们早期新加坡装修同业商联会(RCMA)的秘书。另外这位是陈振岳,他跟我们工会有很大的渊缘。我们最初创办装修同业商联会的时候,他是三位创始人之一。最后一位是蔡水石先生。他是早期进行装修活动的先辈之一。

建屋局最初在新加坡并不叫建屋局,而是改良信托局。河水山大火烧毁了很多房屋,必须重建这些屋子给灾民居住。过后,当时执政的人民行动党正式将它改名成新加坡建屋局。建屋局最初建屋时,是从两房一厅开始。但是,建屋局建的是一个空屋;厨房、客厅和房间都是空的,怎么住人。因此,一些头脑比较快的人就应运而生。他们当时在这样的情形下,一无所有,也不知道什么是地砖、马赛克瓷砖,那要怎么做呢?而当时的行情又是怎么样的?碰到的屋主是好的、坏的、可以欺负的,还是被他们欺负的?今天,就请大家在这里做个回忆。

陈振岳:从1965年到1975年这段时候,原本住在甘榜的 人搬来住进政府组屋。然后,才有我们这些小型的装修商

去跟他们装修房子。但是在那个时候,每个屋主都不懂什么叫塑胶砖、什么叫水磨石瓷砖、什么叫瓷砖。他们什么都不知道,需要由我们装修商来向他们介绍。尽管如此,屋主和装修商很合得来,就是你跟我做好就可以了,不要有其他的问题。当时的两房一厅,两个房间的地面会用泰国的...

林亚峇: 柚木

陈振岳: ...柚木,客厅则用水磨石,厨房就是白色的壁砖。大概在那个时候,普通一间房屋装修到来,是从\$1500到\$3000这样的价钱。1975年到1985年这段时候,屋主年轻的起来了,新建的起来了,有五房式、有四房式,但是这些屋的价格也被提高到很厉害。从1973年开始,装修费用也提高到很厉害。普通一间四房式的装修费用可以从\$6000到\$8000。

蔡水石: 60年代,一天\$15的工钱,已经算很高了。一间屋子,两房一厅做马赛克瓷砖,算到来大概\$1200到\$1500左右。

林亚峇:包括厨房?

蔡水石:包括厨房。

林亚峇: 厨房好像是政府做的。

蔡水石: 厨房也算在里面。我们只是赚一些工钱而已。当时我们不会想要赚很多钱,不会这么想。当时,我们的信用很好,我跟你讲好的东西,

我一定做给你,而你答应给我 的东西,你也会给我。

陈振雲: 因为我是做家私的。如他们所说,当时的装修业非常蓬勃,有很多组屋,所以家私的需求很高。我的爸爸当时是做分期付款的,所以我就依照他的做法,做家私也分期付款。但是,我一开始进入家私业,我就发现很多家私的东西没有人去修理。我一个月单单修理那些东西的收入就足够还我组屋的钱,不要讲我卖家私的钱。我的顾客老实说,大部分都是马来人。这些顾客就是他们所说的,屋子分出来又要做屋子。他们跟我很熟,知道我的为人是怎么的,所以会找我帮他们做。

我们住家的附近有一些人是专门做装修的,我刚好遇到 他和他谈起这件事,于是我就试试看做,而他也教我。我 做的第一间屋子是一桩亏本生意。因为我没有算脚线的 钱。我只算砖、红毛灰和工人费。脚线的钱没算进去就亏 本了。过后,那个人跟我说,我应该算方尺才对。这个方 尺是这样,很多人都这样算。你要赚多,你就加多一点;



你要赚少,这个价钱你一定可以赚的。从那时候开始, 我就会做这些东西。但是当时,我一个工人也没有。上货 呀、敲呀,我都自己包办。最多的时候是80年代...1985年, 你知道我做到怎么样吗?屋主拿着钱来找我,跟我说,你 帮我做,你什么时候做都可以,我钱先给你。

后来,在85年的大选过后,行情大跌。很多人拿了钱却没有跟人家做,拿去马来西亚花天酒地。他们没有做,也没有钱拿去买货,工人也不要跟你做。我就不同。我有时为了要赶工,还会睡在那间屋子里。我在武吉巴督的时候,就经常这么做。隔天一早,我就会驾着我那辆小卡车去买沙、买灰的地方把那些沙灰载回去。因为那时的工人很难找,你的工人一来,如果看到东西不齐,就会跑掉。你很难再叫他们回来了。所以我的做法就是,一定要拉住这几个工人,不给他跑。

陳文献: 我学做马赛克瓷砖,从做学徒到出来做承包商那两年里面,学会了铺马赛克瓷砖、铺地砖。两年后,我自己出来收工作。当时收工作是没有执照的,后来有执照了,我就是申请。有了执照后,我就去租一间办公室,这样开始将生意做起来一直到1985年。那时候,新加坡建了很多屋子,疯狂到整个新加坡找不到工人,而且要买砖也买不到。你要买砖,要先拿钱给材料商,他才肯卖给你。后来,我就自己从意大利定砖、定大理石,我就是在那个时候转行。

林亚峇:"蚊子装修商"的意思就是他早期所介绍的。屋主一来,就有很多人围上来。你住几楼呀,我这边有做一间呀... 对屋主造成骚扰,就像蚊子一样老跟着你。

现在,我们做一个简单的总结。第一,从70年代开始,就有组屋的装修。当时在红山、大巴窑等其他地方,就是建屋局建的第一批组屋开始。当时的两房一厅才卖多少钱,大家还记得吗?

陳文献: \$6500。

陈振雲: \$6200。

蔡水石: \$6200。

林亚峇: 是\$6200。装修业就是从那个时候开始,而当时做装修是没有执照的。1975年,建屋局才开始发执照。当时所发出的执照也不多,大概是两三百个。大家拿了这个建屋局所发出的执照,也就成为领有执照的承包商。

这样一个小型企业也带动了其他人物和小型企业的生存,例如做天花的、做灰工的,做水、做电的。虽然这是一份不起眼的工作,但是在整个装修行业里,这些装修商没有功劳,也有苦劳。我们今天这段历史就大概是这样。

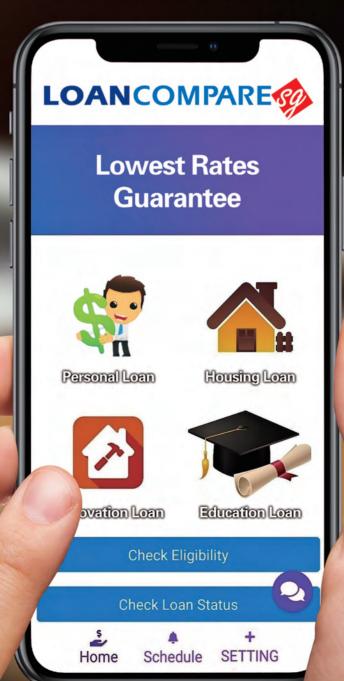


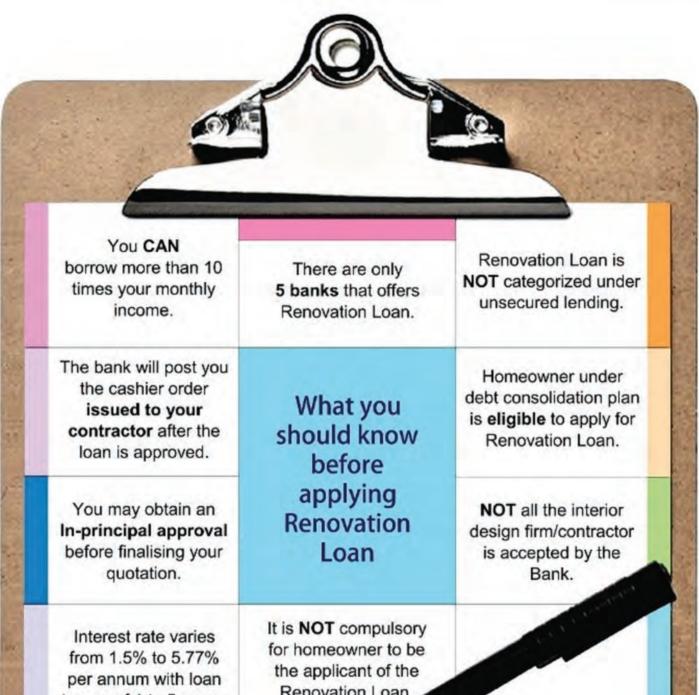






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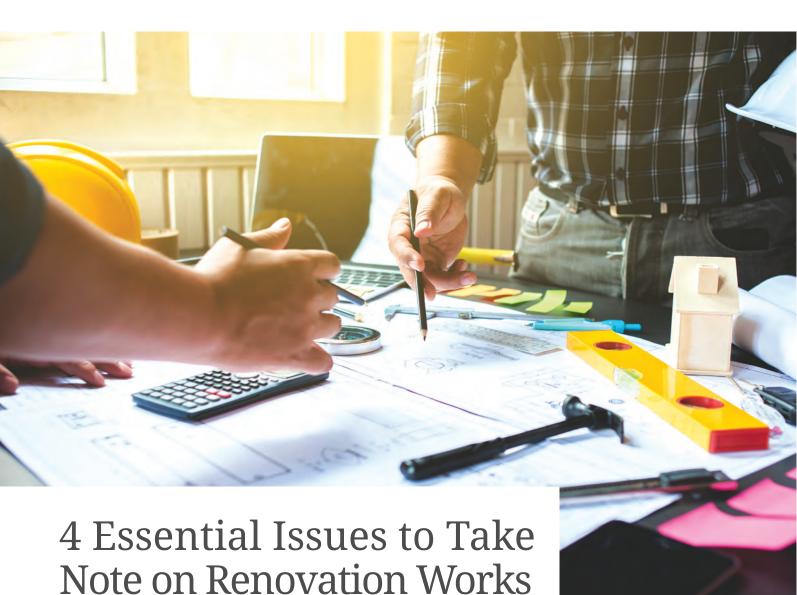

Generally speaking, homeowners have many issues to consider during their renovation. Be it an overhaul renovation of an old house or a resale HDB flat, renovating a brand new BTO flat from scratch, or renovating a commercial space, everyone aspires for the renovation to be a success. Get a good headstart on your renovation journey by taking the following items into consideration.

1 Renovation Budget

This is mainly determined by factors such as the size of the unit, the number of furnishings required and the quality of the materials selected. Taking HDB flat units as an example, the renovation cost for a three-room to five-room flat will range around \$30,000 to \$50,000. If you are looking into more luxurious European styles, the cost can go up to \$70,000 to \$80,000 or even \$100,000.

Before renovation, you should first identify your home or commercial space needs and then set your expenditure based on these requirements. Having determined your budget, do discuss it with a reputable interior designer or contractor about your renovation plans. You should also factor in unforeseen costs which might drive your renovation budget up. Do prepare for a 10 percent increase in your budget for peace of mind.

2. Draw Up a Renovation Contract

Have all your renovation terms stated explicitly in a contract to protect your interests. Honouring a verbal agreement will be difficult with your commissioned designer or contractor and putting down these clauses and conditions in black and white will help prevent future disputes. Here are some terms that should be in your contract.

Payment

Payment should be split up and paid in separate stages based on the progress of the project. Usually, the interior design firm or renovation company will require the homeowner to pay 30 percent upfront of the total renovation cost when the contract is signed; with the rest paid according to the progress of the project.

Schedules

On the contract, the renovation company or interior design firm needs to specify the schedules of the project from the commencement date to the completion date.

Breach of Contract Terms

If the contractor violates any terms or conditions in the contract which causes losses to the homeowner, the homeowner can claim for compensation.

Warranties

The contractor has to offer a guarantee for the quality of the materials being used in the renovation project, as well as a warranty for these materials for a certain time period.

Rectification of Defects

If there are any faults due to defective materials or poor workmanship, the contractor is liable to rectify before the handover of the project.

Resolving Disputes

The contract should include a mediation clause that if a dispute occurs, both parties can seek mediation from RCMA or CASE.

Variations

A variation clause will be useful. If the homeowner needs to make changes to the project, both parties can negotiate to agree to a reasonable deal.

3. Overall Quality of the Renovation

The workmanship and overall quality of the renovation are of special concern to the homeowner, where they place great importance on the final results and look forward to a well-designed home. However, these factors are also most likely to cause disputes between the homeowner and the renovation company.

Therefore, it is important to choose a renovation company or interior designer with a good reputation. Uplifting the standards of renovation in Singapore is Singapore Renovation Contractors and Material Suppliers Association (RCMA), an association dedicated to maintaining the quality of the renovation industry. It provides a good reference for homeowners by publishing a list of renovation companies of good standing in their renovation guidebook.

There are reportedly around 2,180 renovation and interior design companies in Singapore. Most of their service standards are comparable but there are still cases of poor workmanship or of companies that cut corners from time to time. To prevent such unfavourable circumstances, the homeowner should closely supervise and inspect the project during the course of a renovation . If there are defects, the homeowner should notify the renovation company immediately to resolve it, and make the progress payment only after verifying the works are satisfactory.

4. Practical & Comfortable Designs

The ultimate goal for any renovation is to achieve a practical and comfortable design. For home renovations, the homeowner needs to understand the lifestyle needs of his family members. It's best to discuss with every member on their requirements before the renovation commences.

Maximising space, especially in apartments with a small area, should be a priority. In this cosmopolitan city where land is scarce, real estate is a premium. Therefore, it is necessary to make good use of space in order not to waste any precious usable space, and to attain a practical and thoughtful home design. Discuss everything in detail with your interior designer and contractor prior to the renovation and you will be well on your way to a home that caters to your every need.

装修所应关注 的几个问题

一般而言,人们計划装修任何房产都会仔细考慮許多问题。無论是改造旧房屋,装修新旧组屋,装修店面,或者是办公室等等,大家都希望装修好后是美观、实用、舒适且耐用的产品。这里试简单梳理装修前应考虑的几个问题,希望有助于业主达致完善装修的目的。

(一) 装修费用的考量

装修费用可多可少,主要以面积大小,装修项目多少,用料品质等等因素来决定。组屋为例,三房式至五房组屋的装修费一般介于三万至五万元左右,当然也有人花多达七、八万甚至十万元的钜款去装修一间美命美奥的家居。因此,不论装修什么产业,在找装修商之前,应先根据公司或屋主的需要,拟出切合实际要求的预算,然后再找一家有信誉的装修商討论,完成最终的装修方案。另者,有时因后来增加装修项目,费用往往比早期预算要多,业主在预算数目之外再预备一笔约十巴仙的不可预見的开支,这么一来就大可安心。



(二) 装修合约的内容要素

装修合同一般上包括下列几项条款,其内容大致如下。有必要提醒的是条款要以文字清楚写明,不要以口头承诺讲任何项目,以防日后遇到纠纷无法证明及執行。

付款

付款条款应根据工程進展,按各别项目完成后分别支付。 通常,装修商会要求业主在簽合约时先付一笔佔总装修费 用约佔总数百分之三十的费用,其余按工程進展付清。

施工日程

合约上装修商需要写明工程预計由开工到完成的日期進程表

毁约条文

如果装修商违反了合约的规定造成业主的损失,业主就可要求赔偿。



(三) 装修的品质

装修的品质手艺好坏是业主所特别关心问题,同时也是比较容易引起纷争的项目,因为品质好坏比较主观。大部分住宅业主对他们的家居都很重视,期盼装修好的住宅是手艺品质都好的理想家居。

因此,聘用信誉好的装修商对房屋的业主是很重要的选擇。新加坡装修商联(RCMA)在確保装修行业维持高的品质和良好的装修手艺扮演重要角色。商联会都在每年出版的装修指南中附有該会认可的装修商名单供业主参考联络。

据悉新加坡全国估计大约有2,180家装修与室内装修公司,他们的水平和信誉还是参差不斉,虽然整体水平维持良好,但仍不时发生一些装修品质低劣或偷工减料的案例。另者,业主也应該在施工期间,对工程進行監督与视察,如发现不适之处应立刻与装修商商讨及时纠正。

(四) 实用与舒适

装修房产的目的主要是达到实用与舒适。以住房为例,业主要充分了解家人的需要,可在装修前与家人先讨论理清各成员的需要,经过深思熟慮,再做最后定案。善用空间是装修小单组屋者特别要考慮的问题。在寸土如金的大城市里,单位面积越建越小。小单位房产,因为空间有限.要特别懂得善用空间,以期达到实用与舒适目的。因此在装修工程进行之前,业主与装修商和設计師三方要有充的讨论才能达到装修的目的。

品质保证

通常合约中列明工程及用料的保证内容及期限。

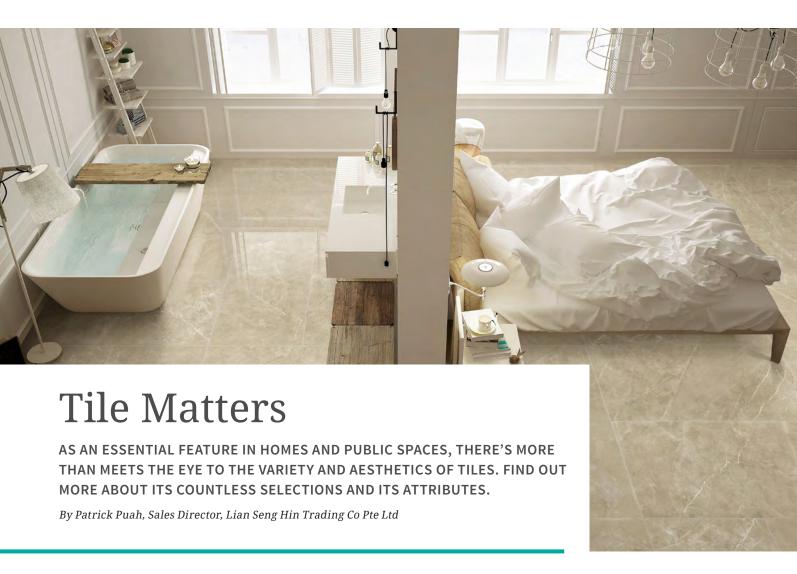

When it comes to tile, technological improvements and lifestyle preferences have brought forth pivotal changes in its design themes, and characterised many imaginations. Tiles are akin to apparel, they have become a defining element in ultimately expressing who we are.

Wide Expression of Styles

The choice of texture, color, materiality and design are some of the myriad options available. They share a common ability to reflect one's individualistic style; complementary or contrasting, bold or muted, colorful or monotone. Right selections can be transformed into light Scandinavian, Contemporary, Industrial, Victorian, or Resort styled beauties to name a few.

Understanding the Nature of Tiles

Faced with plentiful choices, it is advisable to understand the properties and nature of tiles in form or functionality, incorrect selection could lead to grievances on issues ranging from perceived pattern differences, tile spacing, slip resistance, warpage, prone to staining and scratch marks, hairline cracks and many more.



Negative ion and Anti-Bacterial Tile

Central to the COVID-19 pandemic was the search for cure and prevention. The physical and mental well-being of occupants in building takes precedence. In searching for the right material to tile, more emphasis are now placed on tiles that exhibit functional and holistic abilities.

The advent of Negative Ion tiles and Anti-Bacterial tiles that promotes wellness and protects are now extra considerations creating demand for such functional tiles.



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Types of Tiles

Expounding on this topic to reduce misconception, tiles can be classified into ceramic, half/colored body printed porcelain and full body homogeneous porcelain.

Ceramic

Ceramic tiles have higher porosity which means their low density body is not suited for newly constructed walls where contraction may subject them to stress cracking. Overlaying ceramic on existing tile is also not advisable unless proper back substrate and curing is done. Their myriad design patterns, light weight and lower cost means they remain immensely popular to both tradesman and buyers.

Porcelain

Porcelain tiles have low water absorption and with high density body, can withstand higher stress and heavier loading. Porcelain tiles which if termed Homogenous are full bodied and comprised of the same composition throughout. In this regard the patterns are not that varied as compared to half/ colored body digital printed Porcelain tiles.

Matt Porcelain tile can be smooth satin finish or textured/ treated achieving the desired anti-slip effect. Depending on usage needs, selection of tile finish should follow its functional and design requirements. Anti-slip tiles need higher maintenance as its crevices and pores trap dirt, user's habit on dry-mopping or wet scrubbing play a part in determining they should be used for kitchen or toilet flooring.

Polish Porcelain tiles can be further sub-divided in composition and production technique: half homogenous body polish porcelain with less vivid design pattern could be re-polished to achieve the seamless marble feel; however high gloss Glazed Polish Porcelain with digital printed lifelike marble, woodgrain or any conceivable designs are not polish-able.



Attributes & Maintenance

Tiles are fired under high temperature and their body density more or less determines their functionality and usage. It is mindful to note tiles are not 100% in flatness or sizing, tolerance has to be accepted. Caution is advised on this aspect as minimal tile spacing enhances feeling of unevenness and likelihood of de-bonding due to contraction and expansion of tile and substrate.

Like apparel, tiles need to be properly maintained. Cleaning with light detergent will ensure they remain like new. If strong detergent is needed, do consult with Tile Supplier on its suitability.





Falls are a common cause of injury for seniors, and two in three falls among older adults happen at home. Create a safer and more comfortable living environment for your loved ones with HDB's Enhancement for Active Seniors (EASE) programme. Under EASE, you can install grab bars and ramps, and apply slip-resistant treatment to your bathroom/toilet floor tiles, at a highly subsidised price.

Singapore Citizen (SC) households can opt for the EASE improvement items during HDB's Home Improvement Programme (HIP) or apply directly to HDB via EASE (Direct Application).

Under EASE (Direct Application), SC households can qualify if they have a senior member in the family who is:

- 65 years and above; or
- Between 60 and 64 years, requiring assistance with at least one of the Activities of Daily Living (ADL)

The EASE improvement items are heavily subsidised, at up to 95% of the total cost, depending on your flat type. For example, the total cost of installing the first set of grab bars in a three-room flat is \$480, but homeowners need to pay only \$24 (before GST).

As of 31 October 2019, more than 206,000 households have benefited from HDB's EASE programme.

What are the EASE improvement items?



Grab bars, offered in a set, provide good grip and enable seniors to move safely within the flat.

You can choose to install:

- 8 or 10 grab bars in your first bathroom/ toilet, including the kitchen doorway; and
- 6 grab bars in your second bathroom/ toilet



Slip-resistant treatment enhances safety in the bathroom/toilet by reducing the risk of falls.

It can be applied to the floor tiles of up to two bathrooms/ toilets.



Ramps (single or multi-step) can be installed to negotiate level differences within your flat or at the main entrance.

They are recommended for seniors who use wheelchairs.

HDB Renovations, Simplified



Renovating your flat is a major part of building your new home. Make your renovation stress-free, safe and satisfying by following these 3 simple tips.

1 Getting the right contractor

Engage contractors from the Directory of Renovation Contractors (DRC) as they are familiar with HDB's renovation guidelines and requirements, which have been put in place to protect the building's structural integrity.

★ BONUS TIP

Before engaging a contractor listed in the DRC, consult your friends who have engaged the contractor before, or do an online search for reviews. Obtain multiple quotes for the works you want done, to see who can best meet your needs. Go through the following details in your contract carefully:

- Quotation and pricing
- Scope of works
- Proposed timeline for completion

If a contractual dispute arises, try to resolve it amicably with your contractor. Otherwise, you may approach the Consumers Association of Singapore (CASE), Singapore Mediation Centre, the Small Claims Tribunals for assistance, or seek legal redress.

2. Obtaining the proper approvals

Some works require HDB's approval before they can be carried out, such as the hacking of walls.

Renovation permits issued by HDB will state the conditions for the approved works. It is important to check your permit and read the relevant conditions before you let your contractor carry out the works.

Unauthorised demolition and/or hacking of walls may affect the structural integrity of the building, as do unauthorised works, which add excess weight to the building.

3. Renovating responsibly

Renovation generates waste, noise and dust, which might inconvenience your neighbours. Ensure that your renovation contractor carries out work during permitted timings to reduce any disturbances.

Do also remind your suppliers, movers and renovation contractors to:

- Use the lifts properly
- Dispose waste material responsibly

Misusing the lifts can lead to breakdowns, which greatly affects residents, especially the elderly and those who have restricted mobility. Waste materials that are not properly disposed of are fire hazards, and can potentially be a breeding ground for mosquitos.

You are now set!

Carrying out renovation works according to HDB's guidelines will help you avoid inconveniences like having to reinstate unauthorised works, or paying more to rectify any damage.

Finally, every little gesture in maintaining a peaceful and pleasant living environment goes a long way!

Enclosure/ Encasement of gas riser pipes in HDB flats

Gas riser pipes convey gas to the residential flats of the block. These pipes are inspected by HDB-appointed agents every 5 years.

If there is a gas riser pipe running within your flat, it is important that you do not tamper with it, especially during renovation works.

For your safety, if you wish to enclose the gas riser pipe, make sure that the enclosure is:

- Constructed with only lightweight, non-combustible material
- Fully ventilated, with a full-height, 600mm wide removable access to facilitate inspection and maintenance

3 Renovation Guidelines for Happy Neighbours



These three renovation guidelines will help make for happy neighbours:

1 Getting the right contractor

Inform your neighbours of your renovation plan, at least three days before the start of the works. Your renovation contractor is also required to display the Notice of Renovation issued by HDB, outside your flat for the duration of the renovation works.

2. Renovation hours

While general renovations are to be carried out between 9:00am and 6:00pm on weekdays and Saturdays, renovation works that generate noise are to be carried out only between 9:00am and 5:00pm on weekdays only. These works include demolition of walls, removal of wall/ floor finishes, cutting of tiles, and heavy and excessive drilling or hammering works.

Noisy works are not permitted on weekends, eve of major* public holidays and on public holidays – so that your neighbours can enjoy some peace and quiet on their rest days.

*The major public holidays are: New Year's Day, Chinese New Year, Hari Raya Puasa, Deepavali and Christmas.

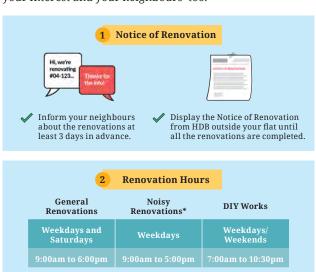

If you are into DIY decoration, do note that works involving drilling or hammering are to be avoided between 10:30pm to 7:00am. If you really need to carry out such works within these timings, do inform your neighbours in advance.

3. Complete your renovations promptly

Ensure that your contractor completes the renovation works within the set guidelines i.e. renovations should be completed within one month for existing HDB blocks and three months for new HDB blocks. This time frame works in your interest and your neighbours' too.





Beware of Bogus Contractors

From time to time, HDB receives feedback about contractors going around the estates, offering to carry out repair works on behalf of HDB. Here is how you can identify a legitimate contractor from a bogus one.

Repair works by HDB are scheduled beforehand

Whenever HDB intends to carry out any maintenance/ rectification works, HDB will write to flat owners beforehand. The letter will contain details of the appointed consultant/ contractor and the schedule of works.

Verification of identity

When approaching residents, HDB staff will identify themselves with their staff passes bearing their photographs.

This is what it looks like:





HDB's appointed consultant/ contractor will also carry relevant identification, which you can request to check. Alternatively, you can call the Branch Service Line at 1800-225-5432 for verification.

What should I do?

If you suspect that a contractor is a bogus contractor, make it clear that their services are not wanted. In the event that they continue to harass you, or give you false information, report the matter to the police.

However, if you choose to engage the contractors' services, do note that it constitutes a private contract/arrangement with the contractors. Thus, any dispute that arises would need to be resolved directly with the contractors.

My Home, I Care

Fixtures and fittings in a home, especially those with moving parts and hinges, will experience wear and tear over time. When they break down, the resulting inconvenience and safety concerns can be stressful.

The good news is that it is possible to prevent sudden breakdowns through regular maintenance. Keeping your flat in good condition also helps you avoid costly repairs in future. The routine maintenance in your flat will go a long way towards an optimal living environment for you and your family.

If it happens...

If – and when – the inevitable happens, engage a repair contractor or ask your friends and family members for recommendations for a reliable handyman service. You may even carry out the maintenance on your own if you know how!

If you are unsure where to locate a repair contractor, you may visit www.hdb.gov.sg/minorrepairs to engage one on a private basis. Bear in mind that all arrangements for the repair jobs are between you and the contractor, and HDB is not privy to them.

Here are some tips to aid you in your home maintenance journey:

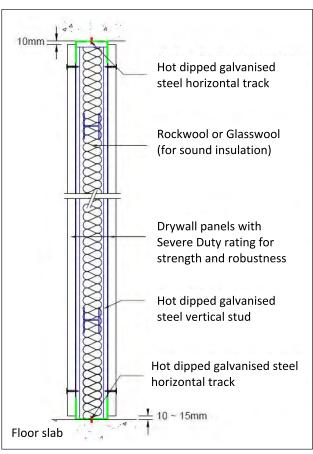
- Replace worn parts early
- Keep the rooms well-ventilated to prevent wall cracks that may result from the expansion and contraction of the materials from temperature changes
- Disconnect any unnecessary appliances and avoid overloading power sockets
- Check the windows regularly to ensure that they are in good condition at all times
- Install a sink strainer to prevent solid materials from entering the sink

Drywall Partitions in HDB Flats

Have you noticed how the internal walls in some HDB flats are made of a different material? This material is known as drywall, and here is what you need to know about it.

Why is HDB using drywalls as the internal partition walls?

HDB has implemented the use of drywalls for the internal partition walls in dry areas as part of efforts to boost construction productivity. It is resilient, yet easier to construct and remove as compared to traditional walls.

With effect from 1 November 2014, BCA mandated for all nonlanded residential developments to adopt drywall as internal partitions for dry areas.

In terms of performance, what is the difference between drywall and concrete wall?

The drywalls used in HDB flats are of the Severe Duty grade, which means they can withhold a loading of up to 25kg at each point. Like concrete walls, drywalls can support common fixtures such as television sets and wall cabinets with the use of appropriate anchors. HDB provides samples of the screws and anchors in your unit for reference, along with a user guide.





Up to 3 kg load per point

Jp to 12 kg load per point



Up to 25 kg load per point

The drywalls installed in your flat are filled with sound insulation material for soundproofing that is as good as, or better, than concrete walls.

Can I mount common fixtures, such as TV or shelves, onto the drywall?

Yes, you can. The drywall used in your unit can support common fixtures such as television sets and wall cabinets with the use of appropriate anchors.

In selecting the location of installing anchors, please avoid the concealed electrical wiring. Visit www.hdb.gov.sg/concealedwiring to check the no-drill area on walls with concealed electrical wiring.

How do you maintain drywalls?

Drywalls are low-maintenance, and do not require any special upkeep. To remove dirt or stains on internal partition walls, you can use a slightly damp cloth and mild detergent.

Pneumatic Waste Conveyance System



As part of HDB's efforts to enhance the overall living environment of residents, the Pneumatic Waste Conveyance System (PWCS) was introduced to newer towns/ districts such as Punggol, Bidadari and Tampines North.

What is PWCS?

PWCS is a smart refuse collection system that uses high-speed air to automatically transport refuse from residential blocks to a centralised bin centre via a network of underground/ suspended pipes. The refuse is then processed and compressed into containers before being towed away for disposal.

Benefits of PWCS

PWCS is a fully enclosed refuse collection system, which helps to reduce foul smells and deter pests from scavenging around the chutes as they are now sealed.

PWCS eliminates the need for refuse collection at each residential block. The land that would otherwise be needed for service roads and refuse handling equipment can be used for greenery instead, thus creating an enhanced living environment for residents.

All the residential refuse served by PWCS are collected at the centralised refuse collection centre. As such, there will be fewer refuse collection trucks moving around the neighbourhood, therefore enhancing the road safety within the estates.

How to use your PWCS refuse chute

Residents living in precincts where a PWCS is installed will benefit from more efficient and hygienic waste collection, and a cleaner and greener environment.

Similar to all refuse chute systems, using the PWCS incorrectly can cause chokages or a breakdown in the system, inconveniencing you and your neighbours. To avoid this, please dispose of your refuse correctly according to the following guidelines:





The size of refuse bag should be smaller than the hopper opening.

To prevent chokage and fire in the PWCS, please DO NOT throw the following items into the refuse chute:





X) Long objects such as umbrellas and brooms





X) Heavy objects such as potted plants and electrical appliances





🗙) Bulky items such as carton boxes and pillows





Renovation debris such as timber, bricks and





Flammable items such as paints, kerosene and burning objects (e.g. charcoal with embers and cigarette butts)

Note: You may contact your Town Council if you require assistance in disposing bulky items.

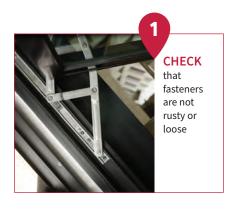


Window Safety and Maintenance

Homeowners can face a penalty of up to \$5,000 and/ or jail term of up to six months for failing to replace all aluminum rivets in casement windows with stainless steel rivets. In addition, should a window become loose and fall because of a lack of maintenance, homeowners can face up to a maximum fine of \$10,000 and/ or jail term of up to one year.

CASE will call on the Bond in the unfortunate event of a failure of performance or unexpected closure of the business. In this instance, the guaranteed sum will be the deposit you have paid.

The key coverage of the bond are as follows:

- Insolvency, compulsory liquidation and bankruptcy of the Insured organisation.
- Death or permanent disability of the Key Partner or Director of the Insured organisation rendering it

impossible to keep the business financially or economically viable and resulting in the insolvency, liquidation and bankruptcy.

For the purpose of this policy, the meaning, intention and definition of insolvency, bankruptcy and/or compulsory liquidation shall be defined as the inability to meet their financial and trade obligations as and when they fall in the usual course of trade or business.

This Policy shall be activated and claims shall be payable when the insured is unable to fulfil their obligations to their Insured Person for more than 30 days on a continuous basis and where is evidenced that all physical function of Insured has ceased for more than 30 working days.

- · A master policy will be issued
- The approved limit will be set in the customised system which the business operator will have access to
- The operator will have to issue a certificate to ALL customers who have paid the deposit
- The limit is on a drawdown basis

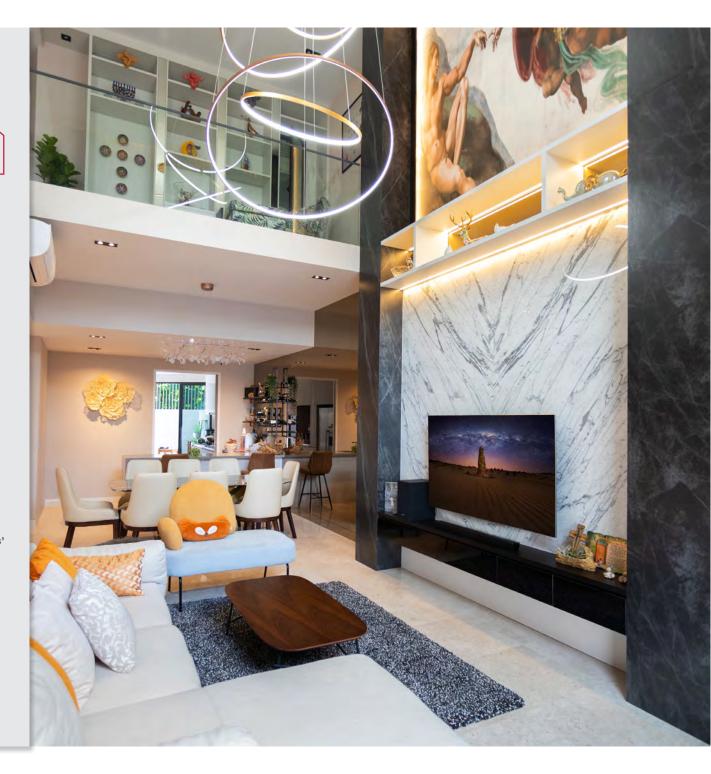

Living Area

As one of main design highlights of this landed home, the six-metre ceiling proved to be an integral aspect of the renovation process. Designer Zheng Jian Wen from Design 4 Space, who helmed the renovation, says: "We put together a two-tone design treatment to scale the feature wall. It is part marble and part mural. We also worked in a loft level to create a cosy space and display showcase." All these additional touches help to elevate the aesthetics and maximise the functionality of the double volume ceiling.

Dry Kitchen

With the homeowners entertaining on a regular basis, having a wellequipped kitchenette was very much necessary. Jian Wen installed an L-shaped counter which hosts ample storage for their food preparation needs. He also sourced for metal shelving to go with the feature wall to emit a floating and lightweight effect.





Dining Area

Luxurious and lustrous surfaces make up the material palette of the dining area. Jian Wen explains more about the material selection: "We wanted to open up the space with a modern and sophisticated expanse, and using dark tinted mirrors and a beautiful dark marble tabletop met the design brief." The mirrored feature wall adds to the impression of space and stretches the visual height of the double ceiling as well.



Master Bedroom

Dressing the feature wall with wallpaper, Jian Wen wanted to bring a softer touch to the master suite. The mural wallpaper achieves the desired effect of injecting a cosy hotel-worthy style. Over at the other side, he utilised wood strips to adorn the wall and to better balance the overall look. Within the wood strip style treatment is a hideaway door which conceals the entrance to the ensuite bathroom.

To conjure an inviting atmosphere, designer Russell Chin from Inspire ID Group worked in Asian Zen style elements through wood strip details on the feature wall. It highlights the visual expanse of the custom-built TV console and with the addition of warm lighting; it also accentuates these modern symmetrical details. Marble-effect laminates are used for the doors of the custom cabinetry and this completes the picture of laidback sophistication.

Kitchen

A bold colour ensemble of blue and white custom carpentry works defines the open-concept kitchen. This wall-free setting and striking colour contrast introduce the contemporary style into the cookspace. For the flooring, Russell chose wood-look homogeneous flooring installed in a staggered arrangement to usher in warmth to the space.





Master Bedroom

Warm colours reign in the master suite which has been expanded by merging two rooms into one. The application of special effects paint (Ottocento AN753) for the headboard wall adds a subtle silver shimmer which aligns well with the soft lighting and custom carpentry. It creates a lightweight, almost floating effect for the bedframe. The TV console feature wall has been laid with dark marble-look surfaces which add to the understated look of luxury in the room.

No hotel-worthy bedroom is complete without a walk-in wardrobe and Russell has fully maximised the bedroom space by framing the room's walkway with custom carpentry. A series of closed and open cabinetry paves the way into the ensuite bathroom and a glass display has also been installed to store and showcase the homeowners' fashion accessories in good order.

Living Area

Once old and outdated, this resale HDB flat unit has been completely stripped and redone to accommodate its new Scandinavian aesthetic. He needed to rectify several pre-existing structural defects such as shoddy drainage piping. With everything resolved, he and his team decked the living area with vinyl flooring and a fresh coat of white paint.

Dining Area

Melding the existing structural fixtures such as the curved columns and cornices in the dining area with the Scandinavian aesthetic was another design challenge faced by Rex and his team. With some ingenuity, he designed a full-height storage fixture to fit in well with the columns spatially and aesthetically. This also serves as a functional visual point to anchor the dining area.





Kitchen

A warm-looking ensemble of wood-look surfaces such as the homogeneous tiles and KompacPlus countertops fills the kitchen with a cosy Scandinavian appeal. 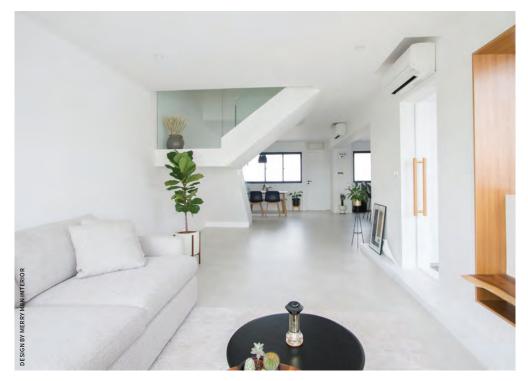

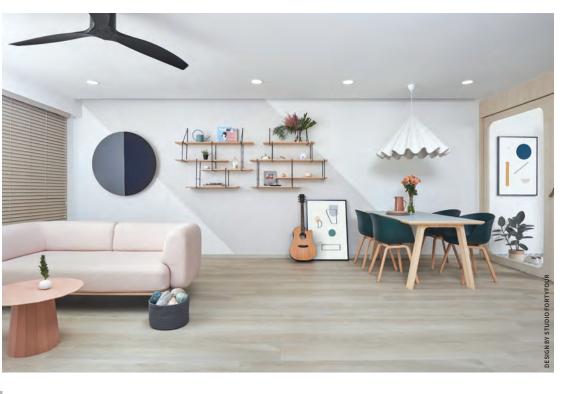

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER KEY COLLECTION? HERE'S A PRACTICAL CHECKLIST ON WHAT YOU SHOULD DO TO MAKE YOUR UPCOMING RENOVATION A STRESS-FREE JOURNEY.



FRONT ENTRANCE

- UTILITIES: Activate your water and electricity supply.
- KEYS: Make sure each key, even the one for the letter box, works.
- LOCK: Get a digital lock or a number lock so your interior designer and the contractor can gain access during the renovation and you can change the code afterwards.
- DOORBELL: Get the electrician to hook up your doorbell or get a battery-operated doorbell.
- FRONT DOOR: With the door constantly open and different professionals coming in and out, check for scratches and damages, especially at the bottom of the door.
- PRIVACY: If your unit faces the lift lobby, you might want to consider a privacy divider such as decorative screen of string curtains.

LIVING & DINING

- **FLOORING:** Check for scratches and uneven installation.
- FURNISHINGS: Measure the floor and wall space for new furniture and entertainment appliances.
- ☐ PAINTING: Look out for cracks and patchy paint work. Get an extra tub of the same paint colour for future touch-ups.
- POWER POINTS: Switch on all the lights, including the bedrooms and kitchen, to ensure it doesn't cause a power trip.
- WINDOWS: Install solar films or day curtains and blinds to protect your furniture from sun damage and keep the space cool.
- SAFETY: Install window grilles if there are young children or pets in your household.
- WIFI: Set a date with your internet service provider to activate your internet connection.
- **DELIVERY:** Arrange furniture deliveries the same day your internet service provider comes so you don't have to take an extra day of leave.





BATHROOM

☐ FLOOR MAT: Place a floor mat outside the bathroom to catch dirt and to minimise wet and dirty footprints during the renovation.
☐ TILES: Use a coin and gently tap on each wall tile. If it is loose or there is a hollow sound, it might indicate the tiles were not bonded properly.

WATER PIPES: Check the piping for water leakages, especially for an old flat or apartment.

GROUT: After chemical cleaning for your tiles are done, there might be holes within the grout lines. Get your interior designer or contractor to patch it up.

FIXTURES: Besides installing the major sanitary fixtures, don't forget about the necessary smaller details like the towel rack and toilet paper and toiletries holders.

BEDROOM

COVE LIGHTING: Besides testing the lighting, look out for cracks, nail holes or uneven joinery for the false ceiling.

WALLPAPER: Always get extra wallpaper so if air bubbles or damages occur later, you have the option of a do-over.

MATTRESS: If your mattress or bed frame arrives early, way before your wallpaper is up; cover it up with plastic covering.

CLEANING: Schedule the cleaning for the floors, cabinetry and window frames after the renovation is done and before any bulky furniture arrives.





KITCHEN

KITCHEN APPLIANCES: Shop for all your built-in major appliances like the hob, hood, oven and even the sink early so it can be incorporated into the cabinetry in time

WET WORKS: Purchase additional tiles just in case some of the existing floor tiles get scratched during the hacking and therefore, requires a replacement.

CABINETRY: Make sure the carpentry has been sanded down properly and feel smooth. Open and close all the cabinet doors and make sure they swing smoothly, and check for uneven gaps when the doors are closed.

WATER HEATER & GAS: Set a date to get your gas provider to activate the gas supply after your water heater and hob have been installed.

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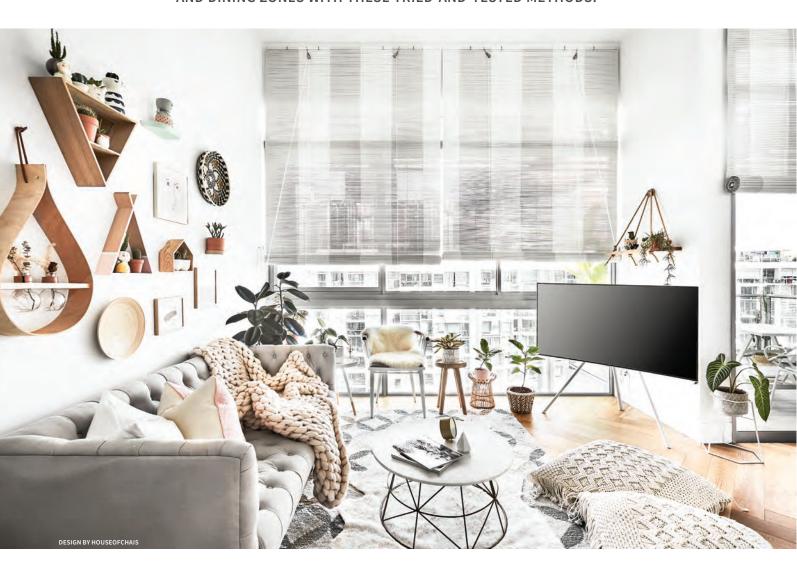


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Configure & Conquer

PLANNING YOUR COMMUNAL SPACE REQUIRES FORESIGHT AND SOME INGENUITY. DISCOVER HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OUT OF YOUR LIVING AND DINING ZONES WITH THESE TRIED-AND-TESTED METHODS.



The local home is all about practicality, which explains why the floorplan is designed with function in mind. While the sizes and layouts might vary, every living space will typically host three hot spots in it communal areas. There's the front entrance or a foyer if there's enough room to make a striking first impression with artful display accents. What follows after is usually the living

zone which functions as a social hub to welcome guests and for the family to indulge in a spot of entertainment and relaxation. Last but not least, the dining zone works as an extended area for hosting guests and an important space for mealtimes and familial bonding. Whether your floor area is compact or spacious, make it work by laying things out in terms of function, size and form.

Balancing Act

Living areas that occupy 4-room HDB flats are analogous to the Goldilocks principle - they're neither too big nor too tiny. Both living and dining zones that have been furnished with full-sized furniture can sit comfortably within its floor area - but you should still be frugal with the use of space when designing these two zones. Think round coffee table that takes up lesser footprint than a rectangular one; or skip the traditional dining place in lieu of its more svelte counterpart – the breakfast counter. Not only will these small but impactful moves give the interior much-needed breathing space, it also provides owners with extra square footage to experiment with more when it comes to designing the living room.



Rather than a regular dining table, a multi-purpose island counter can serve as the dining area as well as a food preparation station.





Divide & Conquer

Residents of 5-room flats are blessed with the luxury of space –particularly in the living area. This means you get to try out different configurations for your interior and furnish it to your heart's desire. Arranging the living and dining zones in a linear fashion helps to keep communication channels open in this part of home.

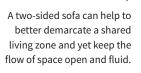
Another popular option with home dwellers is to make use of the bonus Wall partitions tend to feel closed in, so aim to keep it barrier-free unless privacy is priority. Find smart alternatives such as open bookshelves and low cabinets that help to create a division of space without

Living Large

The communal zone in a 3-room flat may be Polly Pocket sized, but it can still be stylish and functional with the right game plan. And that's making your apartment look bigger than it really is.

Keep furniture pieces compact and preferably low-slung, and pare down to only the essentials – like a sofa. If you're one who entertains regularly, outfit it with an ottoman or foldable chairs that can be kept away until the next guest pops by.

A regular coffee table might not fit into your narrow interior; instead, opt for a petite end table that can be shuffled around easily. To avoid space wastage, arrange your furniture flushed against the wall or fit a basket in neglected corners for stashing stuff away.



A multi-purpose trolley table is easy to move around to make space for extra walking room.





Alternatively, a side table with rimmed edges rather than a proper coffee table will also work well in a compact three-room HDB flat unit.



Open Communication

The open plan layout is the new-age, social-savvy version of its more formal and traditional counterpart. Multiple zones like the living room, dining area and kitchen are interconnected in a single space – complementing and flowing into one another seamlessly. Its lack of barriers encourages light to bounce around more merrily to evoke an illusion of spaciousness, making it appealing to small apartment dwellers. Families constantly onthe-go also appreciate how this openness makes the place more conducive to congregating and provides the opportunity for kinfolks to be together while going about their own activities. Without walls, it can be tricky to ground an open plan interior.

To add focus, define it with drama. For example, call attention to the sitting area with a statement light fixture, or create impact in the dining room with a backdrop of wall mural or an artwork. Another tried-and-tested method to define zones is with the use of different floor finishes or covering.



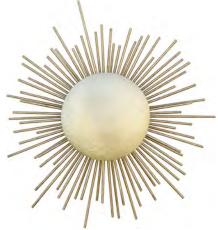

A statement piece such as an outstanding wall lighting or ornate mirror can anchor a space with its dramatic details.



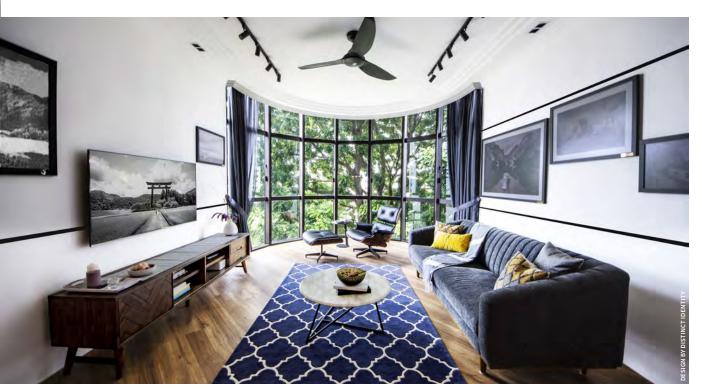
 Create a visual distraction with furniture of irregular proportion instead of something regular and streamlined.

Odd-shaped Layouts

An odd-shaped room happens when walls are either too long or short, or they don't meet at perpendicular angles, resulting in awkward nooks. Instead of fretting over this architectural imperfection, think of it as a fun-sized way to add a focal point in your room. For instance, an uneven corner could be the perfect spot for a potted plant or your collection of travel curios. With wall partitions, offset any off-the-mark proportions by using furniture pieces such as a bookshelf, table or cabinet to counterbalance. However, if you're really at wit's end, it's advisable to rope in the help of an expert to craft built-in cabinetry that will fit your space to a tee.

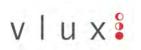












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Less is More

Counter-Free Counters

Apart from making a kitchen appear unsightly, a messy worktop also hinders the home cook from carrying out tasks efficiently.

It's easy to get lost in the labyrinth of space within drawers. Give cutleries and chef's tools a place they can call their own by apportioning interiors with adjustable trays, dividers and inserts. This way, your implements don't get jumbled up and stay where they're supposed to – so you waste less time searching. We also love how the modular nature of these interior fittings enable you to create a customised arrangement that suits your needs. Plus, they're really easy to install.









4. Upgrade Your Pantry

Like the kitchen version of the walk-in wardrobe, a full-size pantry houses all of your food supplies and ingredients in one place. This dedicated provisions storage unit is typically fitted with a motley of storage implements including drawers, baskets, roll-out racks and pocket doors. Some are even equipped with lighting to make searching for a quick midnight snack ever so effortless. To make time spent here even more worthwhile, it's important that you build a space that works most efficiently for you no matter the floor size. While no two kitchens are alike, we've listed the essential design details you can consider when configuring your very own hardworking room.

1 Galley Style for Space-Challenged Kitchens

Characterised by two parallel lines of cabinet units with walking space in the middle, this layout may be lean but it is packed with everything a domestic chef needs to cook up a storm. As the sink, prep counter and cooktop sit in a single row where they're positioned at an equidistant away from the refrigerator, this helps move things along during hectic meals preparation sessions.

2. Glass Partitions for a Brighter & Bigger Appearance

Many BTO flat owners prefer to have glass partitions in place of solid walls to welcome more light into the constrained cooking zone and to encourage a sense of connectedness to the common area. It holds practical value in a small kitchen as they help keep fumes and unpleasant odours at bay and away from the living areas.





3. U-Shaped Versatility

The U-shaped layout is similar to the galley, but it has one access closed off.

Three adjoining rows of cabinets translate to an expansive storage and work surface. It offers versatility to turn a front-facing counter into an island or breakfast counter. This removes the need for a dining table – thus saving precious space.



Island Life
Younger residents are gravitating towards open-plan living; connecting the kitchen to the communal zones and making it a less rigid and more sociable space. Equip the island with seats on one side, and it doubles as a spot for mealtimes. Or use its massive countertop for propping your culinary delights during parties. As the island takes up space, you do require enough square footage to

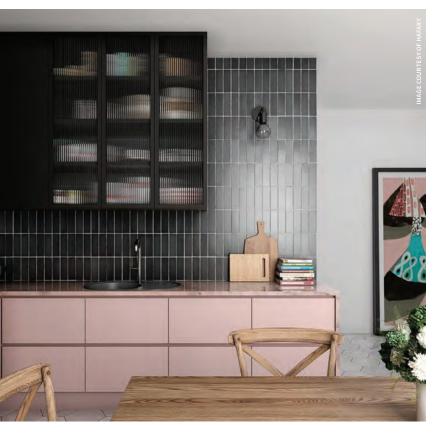
accommodate it.



Smart Add-ons
Islands can be equipped with a sink, a cooktop, or nothing at all. With each component's accompanying accessories on board, there lies a risk of a cluttered appearance – something you might want to avoid especially in open plans. Strategise and invest in smart storage to obscure these less-than-lovely features that might mar your island's beauty.

6. Portable Countertop Space

By using movable carts or rolling butcher block tables, homeowners of cramped kitchens can get extra work space whenever needed. The best part is that these can be pushed out and hidden from sight, or used as a buffet in the dining area when you have company over.



Cocasionally referred to as the corner kitchen, the L-shaped layout is easily the most versatile of the lot because it can accommodate both small and spacious workspaces. Formed by two rows of cabinets that meet at, you guessed it, a corner, its basic dimensions really depend on your floor size. The best part is two users can easily work in the same spot, as the counters face two directions. No jostling for space needed. With more room, some homeowners might even adorn their kitchen with an island.





Open & Airy
To promote an airier appearance, fix upper cabinets only for the side with the longer units. Keep the other side sans wall storage. But if you must, floating or open shelving helps maintain the breezy look.

TAKE DOWN THE WALLS

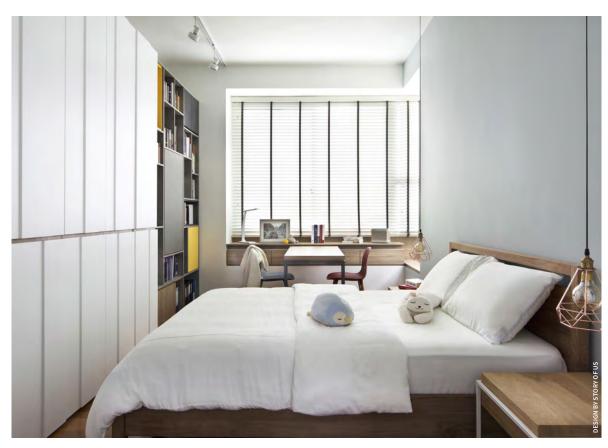

LESS IS MORE

With cramped rooms, scale down the proportions. Rather than fitting in an entire dressing table, take up less footprint with a wall-mounted mirror and shelves or use the bathroom's

vanity instead. Spacious master suites can afford to be filled up with more – perhaps a workstation, a full-length bookcase, or even a reading chair. Remember, balance is key. Don't go overboard in this place for rest lest you'll risk facing much more clutter than before.

It doesn't take a makeup artist to know that good lighting is needed for you to put your best face forward. You wouldn't want to be heading out with a too-pasty complexion, would you? Be sure to outfit your dressing up area with ample lights.



SMART CONFIGURATIONS

Arranging your bedroom furniture largely depends on your floor plan, but the most effective setup is one where the bed, wardrobe and vanity area exist collectively and within close proximity. This is because these elements provide everything you need to kick-start the day.

Locating the wardrobe and vanity area near the bathroom combines a daily necessity with another which in turn creates a multipurpose space that is both efficient and convenient for users. You do not have to go from room to room in order to search for a missing piece of attire or to put on make-up. This way, you can start the day right.

Less time taken to prepare for the day means you can dedicate extra time for slumber. In other words, you can afford to hit the alarm clock, say "just five minutes more", and snuggle in a bit longer.

When it comes to wardrobes, sliding doors need less clearance to open.

BE STORAGE SAVVY

Clutter causes chaos. And in order to create a haven of calm, your personal possessions need a place they can call home. While rooms with more square footage can afford larger wardrobes, tighter rooms can take advantage of the space underneath the bed. Maximise space and minimise visual noise in your master suite by getting your contractor to build a bed frame with built-in storage. Or go all out with a raised platform bed – it provides you with camouflaged storage all across and underneath the decking without taking away precious space.





VISUAL CLUTTER CONTROL

Another way to create an uncluttered appearance in the master suite is by concealing any signs of electrical wiring and air-con trunking that snake along the walls and ceiling of your room. Not only are they unsightly, they tend to make a space appear messier than it actually is. False walls and ceilings do the trick well.

The television's electrical cables can be connected to the adjoining space – the room's walk-in wardrobe – through an opening made on the wall. This ensured that the wires and power plugs are hidden yet accessible.

The Broken Plan

A more sensible spin-off of the open-concept bathroom, this layout sees the wet and dry zones of the bathroom being demarcated. The wet zone which comprises the WC and shower or bathtub is enclosed while the sink is pushed out into the open. The main benefit of this broken plan bathroom is that you get the privacy and one user gets the specific use of the dry zone without intruding on anyone in the wet zone.





Decorative Tiles

For something that is truly one-of-a-kind, customprinted ceramic tiles will jazz up and protect plain walls. It engages a digital printing system to create custom designs and this unique printing technique draws out a hand-drawn, mural-like appeal.

Modular Storage

The String Plex system comes with clear Perspex side panels and offers a floating look which minimises the visual volume in the petite bathroom. With these modular shelves which adapt to your stuff and your future lifestyle changes, these wall-mounted panels are a highly customisable and intelligent storage system.

★ GOOD TO KNOW

Plan for adequate countertop space when designing your vanity. There should be sufficient surface area to set down your makeup and grooming tools.





Water-Saving Attributes

Always choose a dual-flush toilet to reduce water consumption enormously. A smaller wash basin is recommended as less water is required to fill it up. For shower products, showerheads with the air induction feature offer a luxurious experience with a much reduced consumption in water.

Sleek Material Palette

Choosing slim-cut materials, especially for visible surfaces such as the countertop, can render a larger expanse of space. You can also consider a single material or colour ensemble for the walls and floors to blur the boundaries of space for a more spacious outlook.





Boxing it up

For most resale flats and private apartments, the option of boxing up the piping should be carefully considered; especially if you are changing the old pipes to new ones. Having it out of view will definitely improve the aesthetics of any bathroom but boxing it up comes with its challenges. It lowers the ceiling height which might mar the overall appearance of the visual height and accessing the pipes in the event of future water leakages can be a costly and complicated process.

Living Area

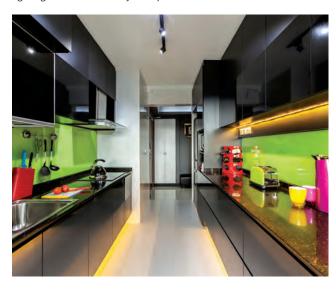


Dining Area

While it ushers in modern opulence, the designers used gold tinted mirror strips to temper these strong textures. It elevates the entire setting and the reflective strips project a larger expanse of space. This sleek ensemble also conceals the entrance to the bomb shelter.

Kitchen

Outfitted in bright tones, the neon green-coloured glass backsplash brings a punch of colour to the black kitchen counters. The designers then installed warm LED lighting along the cabinetry to serve as both ambient and task lighting. By illuminating the base of the cabinetry, the lighting also evokes an airy and spacious ambience.





Master **Bathroom**

A clean-lined design approach to the master bedroom includes a monochromatic colour palette and mirror strips around the headboard design. To enhance the sense of space, the application of warm lighting around the bed base draws out a floating effect which increases the illusion of more floor area.

Living Area

Lining most of the communal zones and hallway to the bedrooms with Craftstone wall panels, this white brick-look effect ushers in a laidback Scandinavian aesthetic. Since the brick textures can seem like a visual overload, the designers went with a lighter style treatment for the TV console and erected a wall-mounted cabinet. Paired with recessed lighting at the base and light wood-look vinyl flooring, the results show off a living area which is airy, spacious and inviting.

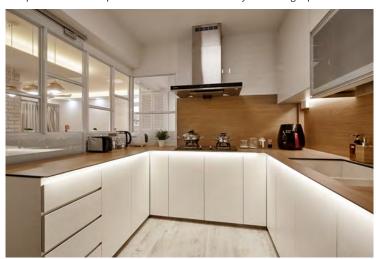


Dining Area

Next to the semi open-concept kitchen, the dining area allows for fluid interactions between the cookspace and living area. This is attributed to its well-planned location where the homeowners can serve food through the serving ledge next to the kitchen or have uninterrupted conversations with family or friends within the connecting communal zones.

Kitchen

Encased by a brand new ensemble of see-through sliding windows after hacking away the boundary wall, the expanse of space and daylight in the kitchen gets a major boost. The U-shaped kitchen arrangement of counters topped by sleek KompacPlus countertops maximise the work efficiency and storage space.





Master Bedroom

Two rooms were merged into one to form this expansive master suite which hosts an intricate classic-inspired door accents. The designers engaged warm lashings of white and soothing woodlook textures to create an understated feature wall helming the bed. For additional privacy, a practical storage divider with a black metal frame has been installed.

Living Area

A streamlined order of design features defines the living space with a modern flair. Led by Head Designer Zac Pong, the DMX Projects team dressed both sides of the walls with a unique treatment of wallpaper, wall mouldings and marble-look surfaces. By using a light-coloured ensemble of wall accents, this creates a brighter and uniformed style which expands the visual appearance of the space. The custom carpentry is regulated to the side and after adding slatted cabinet doors, it also creates a lighter impression and an open path for daylight to enter.

Dining Area

Lightly-textured surfaces such as the woodgrain details and white brick wall conceive a warm atmosphere amongst the main monochromatic colour scheme. The design team hacked away the boundary wall between the kitchen and dining area and this opened up the space considerably. They then created a semi-open concept for the cookspace with a glass panel and a half-height wall to incorporate more kitchen cabinetry.





Bathroom

Keeping things sleek and streamlined, the team chose a neutral colour scheme for the bathroom. It pairs well with the mirrored surfaces and hidden storage which all work together to create a larger and clutter-free visage of space. Recessed lighting which emits a warm glow is also introduced within the open shelving to combat the starkness of the modern-style accents.



Kitchen

Following a modern and clean-lined design treatment, the kitchen is furnished in surfaces of a predominantly grey colour scheme. To break the grey-coloured doctrine, the designers utilised warm-looking woodgrain laminate coverings for the overhead cabinets to create an outstanding contrast.

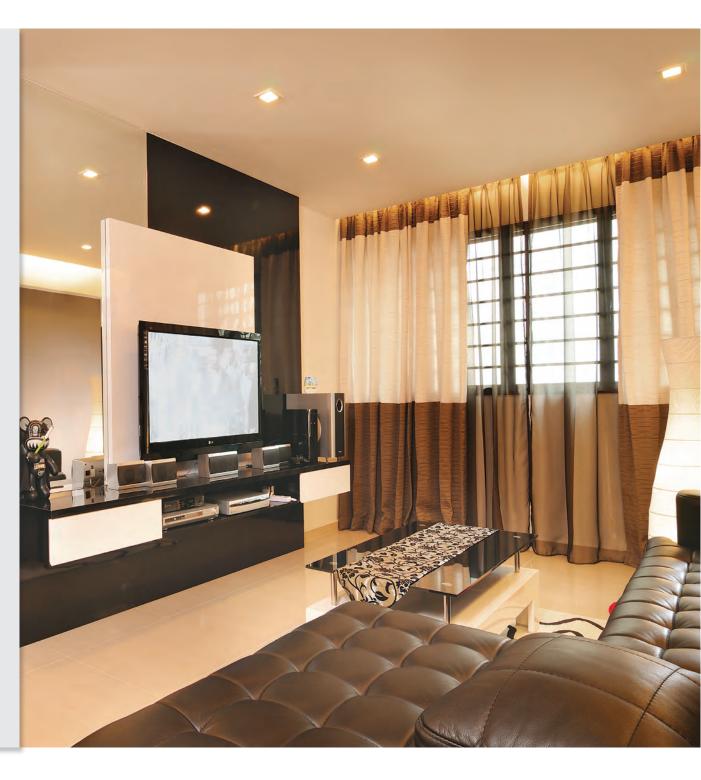

Two hanging bedside tables in a matching design establish design continuity and maximise the functionality of the space. To better mask the recessed wall, the designers used a warm shade of grey to camouflage the structural flaw and accentuate the sense of tranquillity in the room.

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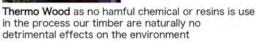


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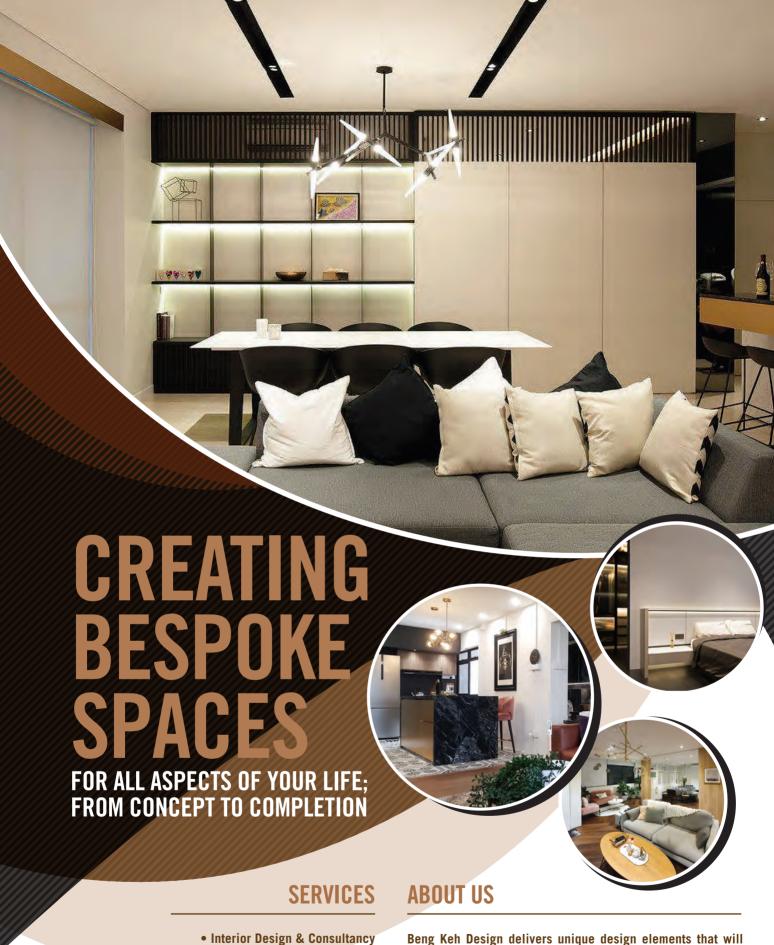
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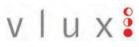
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
